

Q: What made this Dr. Seuss Day extra special?



Book Club

The Covenant Christian Academy Book Club was founded four years ago in 2018 by now junior, Sawyer May. He originally came up with the idea when in seventh grade while doing a novel study with Mr. Baskam.

After wanting to read some other books and motivating his peers, Sawyer decided he would start his own club where they too could select books they've been interested in to read together. "Since I was young, I was the only one I knew who actually liked books so I've always wanted a group I could explore and share books with," he explains.

Book Club consists of its members voting on what books to read, and on their own, reading designated pages they agree upon for the next two weeks. They meet biweekly every Tuesday, and during their meetings they discuss the chapters they read: things such as where they think the plot is going, discussing literary elements and symbolism they noticed, what they enjoy about the book and characters, and deeper discussions about the themes explored in the text.

The books the club has read throughout the 2021-2022 school year have been *The Help*, *Little Women*, *The House on Mango Street*, *The War That Saved my Life*, and they are currently working through *Life of Pi*.

When asked how book club has impacted some of its members, they responded:

"I only read fantasy books before book club, and although we didn't read many in book club at first, I was skeptical at first if I would like it, but I'm glad we are delving into other genres so I can branch out and enjoy all kinds of reading outside my comfort zone!" - Ava

"Book club has helped me find books I didn't know I would ever enjoy without having a group to support me in trying!" - Grayson

"I like the accountability of book club; it helps set students up for success in that area. I also enjoy having a circle I can read with since those around me don't really do so. It also encourages me to read more fiction since I spend a lot of time with nonfiction." - Mrs. Moore
